BRIEF OVERVIEW OF TEMPORARY PROTECTIVE ORDERS

TPO

❖ What is a Family Violence Temporary Protective Order (TPO)?

It is a legal document, granted by the Court, to help victims and their children obtain protection from persons abusing, threatening or putting them in fear for their safety.

What Acts Constitute Family Violence?

Any act that involves violence, force, threat, restraint, bodily injury or places a person in reasonable fear of bodily injury.

❖ Who is eligible to apply for a Family Violence TPO?

- Past or present spouses
- Persons who are parents of the same child(ren)
- Parent or child
- Step-parent or step-child
- Foster parent or foster child
- Person living or formerly living, in the same household

What can a Family Violence TPO DO?

It can order the perpetrator to leave the residence, give you sole use of the residence, grant temporary custody of the child(ren), order child support, give you temporary sole use of a vehicle and prohibit cancellation of marital accounts and utilities.

What is a Temporary Stalking Order

It is a legal document, granted by the Court, to help victims obtain protection from person stalking them.

What Acts Constitute Stalking?

Any pattern of harassing or intimidating behavior, for no legitimate purpose, which puts a person in fear for their safety. Anyone can apply for a Temporary Stalking Order, even if the relationship with the perpetrator does not fall into one of the above categories.

What can a Stalking Order do?

It can order the perpetrator to stay a certain distance away from the petitioner as well as the residence and place of employment. In addition, it would include no direct or indirect contact by any means.

❖ What is a Dating Violence TPO?

It is a legal document, granted by the Court to help victims obtain protection from a person they were in a <u>committed dating relationship</u> with that was abusive, threatening, stalking, or putting them in fear for their safety.

❖ What can a Dating Violence TPO do?

It can order the perpetrator to leave the residence you share, and/or stay away from petitioner's residence and place of employment. In addition, it would include no direct or indirect contact by any means.

Where do I get a TPO or Temporary Stalking Order?

They must be obtained in the **county in which the perpetrator lives.** If the perpetrator is not a resident of the State of Georgia, the Order may be obtained in the County where the abuse occurred within the state of Georgia.

❖ Where can I apply for an Order in Cherokee County?

The Cherokee Family Violence Center, English speaking call 770-479-1804 ext. 200. For Spanish speaking petitioners, 100 Hearthstone Landing Dr. Canton, GA or call 770-479-1804 ext. 111 or 112. Please note: Magistrate Court and Superior Court Clerk's offices DO NOT assist with TPOs in CHEROKEE COUNTY.

❖ How do I Obtain a TPO or Stalking Order?

- The victim completes a petition, including details about the abuse/stalking requesting a TPO be issued.
- Once the petition is completed, the victim will go before a judge. A Cherokee Family Violence Center legal advocate will assist you with these steps.
- If the judge grants the Order, the proper papers will be filed with the Clerk's office.
- A court date will be assigned within 30 days.
- The Sheriff's office will receive a copy of the Order, so the perpetrator can be served with the Order.
- The petitioner must appear before a judge at the scheduled hearing, within 30 days, to determine if the TPO should be extended for up to one year.
- The perpetrator may choose to appear at the hearing or not.

❖ How Can Cherokee Family Violence Center (CFVC) Help Me?

Legal advocates are available to answer question and assist you in applying for a TPO. This process can take from 2-4 hours because of this appointments are encouraged. This service is provide free of charge. To speak with a legal advocate in English please call 770-479-1804 ext. 200, in Spanish please call 770-479-1804 ext. 111 or 112. The legal advocates can refer you to similar agencies in other counties if necessary.

We will help you create a safety plan for you and your children, whether you obtain an Order or not. In addition, CFVC, We provide on-going case management services and helpful classes in recovering from an abusive relationship.
