# **Removal and Storage of Abandoned Vessels**

and

## **Lien Foreclosure Procedures**

## O.C.G.A. §§ 52-7-71 & 52-7-74

These materials were prepared by the Judges of the Cherokee County Magistrate Court. Please be aware that the deadlines and requirements set forth in the Abandoned Vessel Code are different from those found in the Abandoned Vehicle Code. These deadlines and procedures must be followed or the lien claimant risks losing its claim for storage fees.

At the time of this printing, the Georgia Department of Natural Resources and the Georgia Bureau of Investigation were developing procedures for responding to abandoned vessel inquiries. The sample forms provided herein may be helpful in making such requests. It is incumbent upon the lien claimant to obtain sufficient responses from these agencies prior to filing a petition to foreclose its lien.

Please be aware that the person removing or storing an abandoned vessel who does not provide the notice and information required below, <u>shall not</u> be entitled to any storage fees. Any such person who knowingly provides false or misleading information as required below, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

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## **PART I – NOTIFICATION PROCEDURES**

If vessel was removed from **public** property or **public** water at request of law enforcement, and

If owner is <u>not</u> known, you <u>must</u> seek:

- A) identity and
- B) address of last known registered owner

from law enforcement officer or his agency within 72 hrs of removal.

## See AV Form 1

If vessel was removed from **private** property or **private** water at request of property owner, and

If owner is <u>not</u> known, you <u>must</u> notify in writing local law enforcement within 72 hours of removal of:

- A) location of vessel
- B) certificate number
- C) hull identification number
- D) model
- E) year, and
- F) make of vessel.

<u>And</u> you must seek from local law enforcement the identity and address of last known registered owner and if the vessel has been reported stolen.

## See AV Form 1

If the owner is known and the vessel is <u>not</u>:

- A) stolen,
- B) being repaired by a repair facility, or
- C) being stored by an insurance company providing coverage

that person removing or storing <u>shall</u> within seven (7) days of removal notify owner, if known, by certified or registered mail or statutory overnight delivery, giving owner:

A) location of vessel,

- B) fees connected with removal and storage, and
- C) that vessel deemed abandoned unless redeemed within thirty (30) days of removal.

## See AV Form 2

If owner fails to redeem, or

If vessel being repaired by a repair facility, or

If vessel being stored by insurance company providing coverage, becomes abandoned,

the person removing or storing shall within seven (7) days after abandonment:

- A) give notice, in writing,
- B) by sworn statement,
- C) to the Georgia Department of Natural Resources, and
- D) to the Georgia Bureau of Investigation,
- E) stating vessel number,
- F) hull identification number,
- G) the fact that vessel is abandoned,
- H) model,
- I) year,
- J) make, if known,
- K) the date vessel became abandoned,
- L) the date of removal, and
- M) present location of vessel.

Such letter <u>shall</u> request from the Department of Natural Resources <u>and</u> the Georgia Bureau of Investigation:

- A) name and address of all owners,
- B) lessors,
- C) lessees,
- D) security interest holders, and
- E) lienholders of said vessel.

If person removing or storing has knowledge that vessel is registered in another state, such person <u>shall</u> check the records of that other state in an attempt to identify the owner.

## See AV Forms 3 and 4

If person removing or storing becomes aware of the identity of the owner of said vessel, the person removing or storing the vessel <u>shall</u>, within five (5) calendar days, by certified or registered mail or statutory overnight delivery, notify:

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- A) the owner,
- B) lessors,
- C) lessees,
- D) security interest holders, and
- E) lienholders,

of the location of the vessel, that the vessel is deemed abandoned, and that the vessel will be disposed of if not redeemed.

If after all of the above has been completed and the owner of the vessel can not be ascertained, the person removing or storing the vessel <u>shall</u> place an advertisement in the newspaper in the county where said vessel was removed that serves as the county's legal organ or, if no such paper exists, <u>shall</u> post such advertisement at the county courthouse where such public notices are posted. The advertisement <u>shall</u> run or the notice remain posted for two (2) consecutive weeks. The advertisement <u>shall</u> contain:

- A) a complete description of the vessel,
- B) certificate number,
- C) hull identification number,
- D) the location where removed,
- E) the present location of the vessel,
- F) that the vessel is deemed abandoned, and
- G) that the vessel will be disposed of if not redeemed.

## See AV Form 6

The person removing or storing the vessel <u>shall</u> notify the Georgia Department of Natural Resources <u>and</u> the Georgia Bureau of Investigation within seven (7) days if:

- A) the vessel is recovered by its owner,
- B) is claimed by the owner,
- C) is determined to be stolen, and
- D) or for any other reason is no longer abandoned.

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## PART 2 – LIEN FORECLOSURE PROCEDURES O.C.G.A. 52-7-74

Any action to foreclose a lien on an abandoned vessel <u>must</u> be instituted <u>within one year</u> from the time the lien is recorded or asserted by retention.

Demand upon the owner of the vessel for reasonable fees for removal and storage plus the costs of any advertisement, <u>shall</u> be made by certified or registered mail or statutory overnight delivery. Such written demand <u>shall</u> include an itemized statement of all charges. No such demand shall be required if the identity of the owner cannot be ascertained <u>and</u> the requirements of O.C.G.A. § 52-7-71 have been complied with.

## See AV Form 9

If, after the elapse of ten (10) days, from the date of delivery:

- A) the owner fails to respond to said demand, or
- B) refuses to pay, or
- C) if the owner cannot be ascertained,

the person removing or storing may foreclose such lien.

The person asserting such lien may move to foreclose by making an affidavit to the Magistrate Court showing all facts necessary to constitute such lien and the amount claimed. Such affidavit shall state:

- A) that the notice requirements of O.C.G.A. § 52-7-71 have been met,
- B) that a demand for payment has been made and refused, or
- C) that the identity of the owner cannot be ascertained.

## See AV Form 10

The filing fee for such affidavit shall be \$5.00 per vessel.

With the filing of the affidavit, the lien claimant <u>shall</u> give the clerk the address, if known, of:

- A) the owner,
- B) lessor,
- C) lessee,
- D) security interest holder, and
- E) lienholders of the vessel.

The clerk shall give notice to each of the above addresses provided of the right to a hearing to determine if reasonable cause exists to believe that a valid debt exists; such

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hearing must be petitioned for within ten (10) days after receipt of such notice; and if no petition is forthcoming within time allowed, the lien will conclusively be deemed valid.

Any notice required above <u>shall</u> be by certified, registered, or overnight mail, and if the owner, lessor, lessee, security holder, and lienholder are not known, by posting notice at the courthouse.

If a petition for a hearing is filed within ten (10) days of notice given by the owner, lessor, lessee, security holder, and lienholder, the court shall set such hearing within ten (10) days of the filing of petition.

If the court determines that reasonable cause exists of the valid debt, the person asserting the lien <u>shall</u>:

- A) retain possession of the vessel, or
- B) the court shall obtain possession of the vessel by court order.

The owner-debtor may obtain possession of the vessel by giving bond and security in the amount due, plus costs of the action.

Within five (5) days of the probable cause hearing, any party defendant must petition the court for a full hearing on the question of the valid debt. If no such petition is filed, the debt will be conclusively valid and the foreclosure granted. If the petition is filed, the court shall set the hearing within fifteen (15) days of the filing of the petition. Upon the filing of the petition, neither the lienholder, nor the Court may sell or dispose of the vessel.

If, after hearing on the petition above, the Court finds the debt valid, the Court shall grant the foreclosure upon and sale of vessel subject to the lien if such debt is not otherwise immediately paid.

If the court finds that the actions of the person asserting the lien in retaining possession of the vessel were not taken in good faith, the court may award damages to the owner, or any interested party, due to the deprivation of the use of the vessel.

If no petition is filed, or if, after full hearing on the petition, the Court finds a valid debt exists, the Court shall authorize, by order, the sale of the vessel. The holder of a security interest in or lien on the vessel, other than the holder created by O.C.G.A. § 52-7-73, shall have the right, in order of priority of such interest, to pay the debt and costs. If this occurs, that person shall have the right to possession of the vessel, and that person's interest in the vessel shall be increased by the amount paid. A court order shall be issued to this effect, and no sale of the vessel shall occur.
